The fellowship is two years. **Successful applicants must be board eligible in emergency medicine.**

Fellows will have the opportunity to earn a Master's Degree from the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health or Kennedy School of Government. The program is designed for those seeking a successful and productive career at the intersection of health policy and emergency care. The curriculum is tailored to the fellow's interests and is divided into four areas:

1. Health Policy

2. Health Services Research 4. Social Emergency Medicine
